We are happy to report that the Marine Navigation (formerly Piloting) class has wrapped up with 7 members taking the test. Captain Rich Fortunato did a great job with the class and we are looking forward to the possibility of offering the Advanced Marine Navigation (formerly Advanced Piloting) course in the fall. See the September Bilge Pump for the entire 'line up' of classes for the fall.

The 9 March ABC class was completed with 2 students and the 4 May class was just completed with 6 students. All students passed the test and are now able to get their DEEP Certificate to Operate Power Boats.

Our ABC courses are 8-hour courses meeting the requirements of the State of Connecticut DEEP for its Certificate of Personal Watercraft Operations.

Upon passing the final exam the students receive the Hartford Power Squadron's Certificate attesting to the passing of the NASBLA test which can be used in any State to apply for a License or Certificate to operate a power boat.

The Connecticut student will then be able to apply on-line for the State of Connecticut DEEP Certificate of Personal Watercraft Operations.

Annual Report of the Commander

The Hartford Power Squadron had a great, activity packed, year. Our Change of Watch Dinner was well attended on April 16, 2023 at Portofino's Restaurant in Kensington, CT.

We held our 2nd Annual Boat Show /Swap Meet at the Westbrook Outlets and our Second Annual All Cash Raffle. Both events went off very smoothly and netted our Squadron a profit of approx. \$900. We decided to move the 2024 Marine Swap Meet/ Craft Show to the West Marine parking lot in Old Saybrook and pushed the date out to May 18th.

Our Executive Department's CoOperative Charting efforts did not go unnoticed by National. We held our Coop Charting event on June 10,2023. Our Squadron was ranked 9th in the country, and ten of our members received individual awards for their actions. Great job, guys.

May Meeting Features: Night Boat to New York

Steamboats on the Connecticut, 1815–1931

Night Boat to New York: Steamboats on the Connecticut, 1824-1931, is a portrait of the vanished steamboat days—when a procession of stately sidewheelers plied between Hartford and New York City, docking at Peck's Slip on the East River in the shadow of the Brooklyn Bridge. At one time, Hartford could boast two thousand steamboat arrivals and departures in a year. Altogether, some thirty-five large steamboats were in service on the Connecticut River in these years, largely on the Hartford to New York City route. These Long Island Sound steamers, unlike the tubby, wedding cake dowagers of Western waters, were long, sleek craft, with sharp prows cutting a neat wake as they cruised along. Departing each afternoon from State Street or Talcott Street wharf in Hartford, the "night boats" reached New York at daybreak, inaugurating a pattern of city commuting that continues to this day. Steamboating not only brought people and goods—Colt's firearms and Essex's pianos—down river to New York for export to world markets, but also helped America's inland "Spa Culture" transplant itself to the seashore, making steamboating not just convenient transportation but also a social phenomenon noted by such writers as Charles Dickens and Mark Twain. No wonder crowds wept in the fall of 1931, when the last steamboats, made obsolete by the automobile, churned away from the dock and headed downriver—never to return.

About the Author

Erik Hesselberg has been writing about the Connecticut River for 20 years, first as an environmental reporter for the *Middletown Press*, and after as executive editor of Shore Line Newspapers in Guilford, where he oversaw 20 weekly newspapers from Old Lyme to Stratford, CT. He was president of the Middlesex County Historical Society and developed the award-winning exhibit "A Vanished Port," on the Connecticut River's ties to the slave economy of the Caribbean islands. His writings have appeared in *Wesleyan Magazine*, the *Hartford Courant, Estuary Magazine*, and on his blog, Voicesontheriver.com. He lives in Haddam, CT.

Long-Time Boating Instructor: Barry Gordon

It has come to our attention, belatedly, that our long-time boating instructor, Barry Gordon, passed away on March 22, 2019, at age 78. Barry taught 100s of State residents Basic Boating over a 29-year period. He received his 'Life Membership' (25 Merit Marks) in 2002 and ended up with 29 Merit Marks.



Barry graduated from Weaver High School and went on to the University of Connecticut to study Pharmacy. He worked as pharmacist in his own store, Thrifty Drug of Newington and then went into the Drug Enforcement Agency for the State of Connecticut. After his retirement, he decided to go back to working in pharmacy at Bordonaro's. He was also an Air Force veteran.

Barry was not just committed to the Hartford Squadron. He loved to fly planes, sail boats, hunt, fish, do computing, cook, and spend time with family. He was also an educator at heart; he taught photography courses, computer classes, Hebrew School, as well as being one of our boating instructors.

Our Annual Meeting on 26 March 2024 featured "Hatchery Season at the Fishers Island Oyster Farm"

with Jay Letendre

Jay Letendre described the four main reasons for aquaculture as consumption, ornamental, restoration, and research. Of the five species of oysters in America, their farm specializes in the 'Eastern' or 'Atlantic' oyster. An adult oyster can filter 50 gallons of water per day, and they find the visibility is about 8 feet to the bottom of their farm while they can't see half a foot nearby.

Some hatcheries use the 'flow through' method in which the hatchery allows water to flow through tanks continuously. They prefer the 'stagnant' method in which they change the water daily, but the method reduces the amount of algae he needs to produce and the amount of filtration and heating they would need as a "flow through" system.

To start the process in November, they choose the best 'brood stock' from last year's oysters. This choice includes overall appearance, good edges, and healthy oysters. He showed a frame with only 25 oysters and stated they could get 50,000,000 fertilized eggs from them. They would only lose about 10% after they 'set' and they are fairly indestructible after that.

In the late spring, the oysters are ready to go outside and they are placed in upwellers and grown for an additional 2-3 months, then moved to pearl nets on long lines and hung in the water. They can't hang too deep as the amount of oxygen in the water declines after about 5 feet in their nursery.



In order to create an attractive oyster, the team must bring them out of the water for some time each day so the manual effort is considerable. He described an advanced farm in Europe that has equipment to do this, controlled by a cell phone program.

When the oysters reach 1.5" to 2" in size they start sending them to customers. Speaking of customers, Jay brought a supply to the meeting that Hannah, his coworker and significant other, handpicked that morning and served raw oysters to everyone wanting them. It was a great wrap-up of our annual meeting.


